## Where can James leave Mindset?

### Resources

World map / atlas and a copy of James's proposed travel route.



### Learning Objectives

KS1 I can name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.

I can use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including ports and harbours.

KS2 I can identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, N and S Hemisphere.

I can locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe and North and South America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities.

### Geographical Skills

Use globes/maps/atlas/digital mapping/technology to follow and plot a route and a specific location.

### Activities

KS1 - Locate and look at the different coastlines that James experiences on his journey - what continent are they part of? How can James safely dock his boat, Mindset, while he spends time on land? Discuss ports and harbours - what are the main differences between the two? Why would they be a good place to leave the boat?

KS2 - Locate the countries in which James docks Mindset.

Independent research task - find out more about the countries / cities that James visits and present orally or in poster form. Compare their size, population, economic activity, etc.
